

General guidance for copyright and confidentiality

Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)

UKIERI has issued clear guidelines for any IPR implications associated with research projects awarded under the initiative. UKIERI would not have any IPR decision making and both the Indian and UK research teams and in particular any commercial partners or investors in the project should decide on their approach to IPR. However, appropriate acknowledgement of the UKIERI project, British Council's and the UKIERI funding partners should be made.

Publications

Any publication issued as a result of the work of the UK or Indian Institution should express acknowledgement of the Indian and UK Institution's copyright and the following statement:

"This document is an output from the UKIERI (UK India Education and Research Initiative) project funded by the Department for Business, Innovation & Skills (formerly DIUS), FCO, British Council, Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, The Scottish Government, Department of Learning-Northern Ireland, Welsh Assembly, GSK, SHELL and BAE for the benefit of the India Higher Education Sector and the UK Higher Education Sector. The views expressed are not necessarily those of the funding bodies."

Media and Marketing

All collaborating institutions have also agreed to grant UKIERI through the British Council, a world-wide royalty free licence in all media in perpetuity to use the reports and materials and any other documentation produced in the course of the contract, except the financial documentation required to be produced under the contract.

UKIERI also encourages institutions to acknowledge the UKIERI project, the Council's and the UKIERI funding partners in all marketing, dissemination material including conferences, seminars and events.
